Mission Care is a Christian charity that has served communities in South East London for over 110 years.

Our charitable objectives have always been to relieve poverty, relieve sickness and advance the Christian faith. These are realised through the provision of nursing and residential care to vulnerable members of our local communities and also through our charity shop and cafe, as well as our work overseas with Mission Care International.

OUR HISTORY

Initially known as the Bermondsey Medical Mission, Mission Care was established in 1904 by Dr Selina Fox, to provide medical and spiritual support to society's most vulnerable people.

Mission Care expanded considerably throughout the first half of the twentieth century, delivering a purpose built hospital, missionary training and further services in Brook Lane, Mottingham and other parts of South East London.

Mission Care has always adapted to suit changing social needs. In the latter half of the twentieth century, Mission Care's pioneers recognised a growing need to provide care for older people.

Our first homes for older people were opened in Bromley during the 1940s and 1950s and today, the provision of high standard nursing and residential care for older adults and people with disabilities continues to be our prime focus.

To recognise our development as an organisation, the Bermondsey Medical Mission was formally renamed Mission Care in 1991.

The heritage of Mission Care continues to guide our work today. We continue to promote the ethos and values upon which the organisation was founded and work to realise the vision and commitment of our founders to improve services for the elderly and the sick.



OUR HOMES

We are privileged to offer a loving and comfortable home to over 200 residents in five care homes in Bromley and Southwark. Every one of our homes is committed to delivering a high standard of person-centred care that serves our residents' social, physical, clinical and emotional needs.

All of our homes are safe and secure and are registered with the Care Quality Commission. Recent inspection reports are available to view in each of our homes and on our website.

OUR STAFF

We recognise that our most valuable resource is our staff, without whom we would not be able to provide the high-quality nursing and residential care to those that we serve.

We are confident that a career with Mission Care is both rewarding and challenging and we are committed to on-going training and development for all of our staff members. The majority of our care and nursing staff have worked with us for at least four years – ensuring continuity of care for our residents and demonstrating the commitment and dedication of our care team.

MISSION CAFE

Mission Cafe opened its doors to the public in January 2015 and has been welcoming regular customers ever since. The cafe welcomes everyone but also has a special focus on providing a safe and supportive environment for people living with dementia and those who care for them, fulfilling our vision of creating a comfortable space that reaches out to the wider community.

Mission Cafe is located in The Mall in Bromley town centre and is open Monday-Saturday, offering a range of hot and cold sandwiches, soups, sweet treats and hot and cold drinks.



BRIX

Our charity shop, Brix, opened in 1993 and quickly became a firm favourite among the local community. Located on Chatterton Road, a busy shopping street close to Bromley Common, the shop is regularly stocked with clothes and accessories, books, small electrical items and lots of interesting bric-a-brac.

Brix is open from Monday to Saturday between 9am and 4pm and welcomes donations large or small.



MISSION CARE INTERNATIONAL

Mission Care International was established in 2004 to complement and advance our work at home, by seeking to serve vulnerable and marginalised people outside of the UK.

We work alongside partner charities that already operate in the developing world through the provision of capital funding and professional support services to ongoing projects that support our charitable objectives and ethos.
